Therefore, it is requested that no more than four pieces of art per artist. Also, please keep your framed art within the size perimeter of 24"x30". Anything beyond those dimensions, will be considered to be the equivalent of two pieces of art.
- Your artwork identification tags will provide enough space to add additional information about how your artwork was created. All titles and information referencing your art is due by Monday, July 14. Very generous door prizes in the form of a book and a painting have been graciously donated by Donnalynn Chase and Frieda Tesler respectively.
- The Artists' Reception is scheduled for Sunday, August 3 from 1:30 – 3:30 p.m. As of this writing, we do not have volunteers to coordinate the set up and tear down of the reception. All art is to be picked up from the Rose Shenson Gallery on Saturday, September 6 from 11:00-noon. More information regarding this topic will be included in upcoming e-mails.
