### President's Message

As artists with our heightened sensitivity to our environment and fellow beings, we are bound to feel the stress and anxiety of the current daily turmoil we find ourselves in. I'm concerned about our members and how they are coping. We are fortunate that we have our art practices to dive into; to step away from the insanity and immerse ourselves into our creative worlds. But sometimes, because of our feelings and empathy, we find ourselves hamstrung and unable to even lift a paint brush. Maybe I'm just speaking for myself, but I think you are all feeling it, too. I'd like to offer the following suggestions I have found helpful from psychologists.

- Limit your news consumption to one or two sources you trust to stay informed. It doesn't help to bury your head in the sand and ignore everything because it will still be there when you lift your head up. Regardless of how you feel, you are not without power and hope.
- Take a social media break, accessing it no more than once a day. Most of it is not factual anyway.
- Focus on what you can control. Turn your attention to your own health, your family and friends as well as local communities. Be with others like your Guild and other social groups, hobbies, and exercise.
- Use your power no matter how insignificant it may seem. Combined with others, it becomes

- more powerful. Contact your representatives; it's easy and doesn't take much time. The satisfaction with taking action relieves some of the stress and is well worth it.
- Live your values that guide your behavior. Be true to yourself while still respecting and caring about others even when you disagree with them. Remember the "Man in the Mirror."
- Seek support from someone you trust, such as a close friend or counselor. Be lifted up.
- Be kind to yourself and to others.

Although I've strayed a bit from the subject of art, as artists we are fortunate to have the insight that our passion gives us. We can support each other, delight in each other's creations, give positive feedback to each other and be present. As your Guild President, you are important to me. I love the relationship we have and the fun of coming together for the sake of art.

Many of you will be delighted to know that in our February meeting we will continue the video art lecture entitled *How to Look at and Understand Great Art* with Professor Sharon Latchaw Hirsh. In this next video she will be discussing:



- No ribbons or awards will be presented.
- No framing is necessary but your art must be dry to handle by the specified deadline.
- If creations are made using dry media or water media on paper, the art should be under a matt for protection and, if available, a plastic sleeve.
- Artwork is presented to membership three (3) months from the date announced.
- Artists will share their finished art to membership; how they approached the project, medium used, etc.
- The use of copyrighted photos from any source is prohibited.
- Art created in workshops or online courses is prohibited.

#### Instructions:

- 1. You may submit up to 8 JPEG images of your best art. **Do not** provide images in a document file.
- 2. JPEGs must be identified with your name and art title (e.g., BOverholt-Morning Mist.jpg).
- 3. Include a brief biography in Word (.docx) or a PDF file (.pdf). Biographies may be edited for brevity and content at the discretion of the News Editor.
- 4. If you already have a biography on file and wish to use it (Annual Art Show), advise the Newsletter Editor.

#### **Provisos:**

- 1. JPEG images must be a replica of the original art. No visible mat, glass or frame.
- 2. Submit only art created within the last five (5) years.
- 3. Art should be photographed straight on (no flash) and cropped to remove any extraneous background.
- 4. Ensure your images meet the above requirements or they will be rejected.

#### **Artists Currently Exhibiting on Website**

- 1. You may elect to remove current artwork and update with new art.
- 2. Specify which art piece is to be removed.
- 3. Follow all the **Instructions** and **Provisos**.

#### **Exhibit Committee Report - Annual Art Show**

- We have found venues are either limited in size, restricted to local community or too expensive.
- Barb will be contacting the office manager of the First Congregational Church of San José (FCCSJ) regarding their Fellowship Hall as a possible one-day exhibit venue.
- Barb met with the church administrator at Santa Teresa Hills Presbyterian Church (south San José) for a one-day outdoor exhibit. Information is forthcoming on rental of its Fellowship Hall.
- Although already booked for 2025, the Cura Contemporary Art Center in Morgan Hill is a possibility for the future.
- Jewish Community Center is too expensive.
- The committee will reconvene in two weeks.

Meeting was adjourned at 3:13 p.m.


