Talented Plein Air Artist Wows Guild Members

Our January 27 demonstrator was plein air artist Julia Munger Seelos who skillfully created a farm scene in oils alla prima.

Julia's tools and palette ...

- A variety of bristle and synthetic brushes of all sizes
- Odorless cleaner
- Palette Colors White Ultramarine Blue Cerulean Naples Yellow Pale
 Cadmium Lemon Yellow Alizarin Crimson Violet Gray Cadmiums: Orange, Yellow-Orange, and Red
- The use of the above colors made for a cohesive painting.
- Starting with a toned canvas consisting of a mixture of odorless cleaner, orange and alizarin, Julia then wiped off the paint spreading it over the entire surface.
- Making a thin batch of ultramarine and alizarin, she sketched in her composition (Figure 1).
- For the foliage underpainting, she used a darker batch of ultramarine and alizarin (Figure 2).

- She added orange to the ultramarine and alizarin for the barn shadows and darkest darks (Figure 3).
- At this stage, she is applying paint thicker.
- Adding more orange and blue for the barn's sunny side.
- Alizarin, orange, and yellow-orange mixture is applied for the barn roof.
- Ultramarine and orange are used for the tree shadows; adding ultramarine and naples yellow pale for tree highlights (Figure 4).
- Darker trees ultramarine, alizarin, and orange.
- The sky was applied wet-on-wet using cerulean blue and white (Figure 4).
