Encourage Guild members' artistic public service opportunities. We hosted a presentation from the founder of *Engage as You Age* but it was not specifically related to art. Other opportunities that come up during the year will be forwarded to you.

Provide interested members with opportunities to learn more about how to promote their art on social media and how to establish an art business. I will inquire with membership to determine if there is an interest.

Increase the visibility of the Guild within the community. We still need to increase our visibility through exhibits and publicity, and the Guild now has an active Publicity Committee which established our presence on Facebook and beginning to develop an Instagram site.

Assist members in becoming more comfortable working together and meeting via Zoom. All current members appear to be familiar with attending Zoom meetings.

- 1. All items will have bid sheets attached on or nearby.
- 2. An announcement will be made five minutes prior to the closing of the silent auction.
- 3. Bid sheets cannot be removed from their designated spots except by authorized persons.
- 4. Only authorized persons may nullify a bid.
- 5. The silent auction is presented for 30 minutes.
- 6. In the event of a dispute, one of the official auctioneers shall act as the final authority and shall determine the winning bidders. The decision shall be final.
- 7. The successful bidder must make payment in full the day of the silent auction.
- 8. Payment may be made with cash (please have small bills) or check payable to **Campbell Artists' Guild**.
- 9. Returned Check Fee = \$25.
- 10. All sales are final and no exchanges, substitutions or refunds will be honored.
