



"Love the composition; the relaxed feel and beautiful rendering."





It was suggested that the Artists Trading Cards could be cut from a previous piece of artwork the artist wasn't particularly happy with but had a small section with character. Many important deadlines are coming up and Barb sent membership an email with a synopsis of the deadlines to avoid any confusion.

Guild Website

Programs Chair

Mary forwarded the demonstrator information to Cathy Down and Jennifer Glover. January's demonstrator has been secured and the new Programs Chairs need to start work in securing demonstrators for the rest of 2022.

Returning to In-person Meetings

The first in-person meeting is tentatively scheduled for January 29. Marlene suggested that we may want to consider targeting the start of in-person meetings to February as pandemic cases will likely rise during the holiday season.

Barb sent a sample survey to Board members for review that included detailed multiple-choice questions regarding member's comfort levels in returning to in-person meetings. Barb's original intent was to send the survey through Google Forms per Elton Glover's suggestion but after much discussion, the Board agreed to send one email to membership with only one question:

"Assuming all city, county, and state mandates (mask-wearing and social distancing) have been lifted, are you comfortable in returning to meeting inperson beginning January 2022? Yes or No."

Masks will be optional at meetings. Proof of vaccination will be mandatory upon first attending a meeting and the Membership Chair will keep information on who has been vaccinated.

Treasurer's Report

Sharon has received seven Active membership renewals so far. In mid-September, the rental paperwork was taken to Cindy (administrator for First Congregational Church of San Jose) to renew our meeting contract. Sharon will inform Cindy on a month-by-month basis on whether we are meeting and Cindy agreed to that arrangement.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:20 p.m.

Workshop on "Accessing Your Abstract Artist Soul"



President Diann Klink presented a unique workshop for membership on October 23 involving the various aspects to creating an abstract painting. A bit of meditation, various forms of music, and creating lines and shapes and doodles with your eyes closed were used in getting us started. For those unable to attend this workshop, questions were answered and discussed such as "What is Abstract Art?" and Diann provided examples:

Artist Diann Klink

Diann expounded on what abstract art is ...

- Music without words
- Colors, lines and shapes
- Portal to your imagination
- Visual and emotional stimulation
- Viewer's interpretations
- Non-objective and representational or a combination

Don't let those prickly obstacles get in your way ...

- Questioning whether the work is legitimate
- Your inner critic or perfectionist
- · Fear of failure and self-doubt
- Our conditioning and training
- · Self-judgment and desire to impress

Artists were given a list of supplies ahead of time that were needed in order to participate and access their abstract soul. This workshop was very enlightening, a big hit with those who participated, and provided a new perspective into a sometimes perplexing art form. So enjoyable that member Jennifer Glover suggested that a slideshow be created from everyone's abstracts that were created today and placed on the Guild's YouTube channel. Excellent idea!
