6. Remember that creativity is a process not a result.
7. Understand that the best realist art has a solid abstract foundation.
8. Be self-critical but enjoy what you're doing.
9. Understand that artists need support, especially from one another.
10. Keep learning no matter how much you think you already know.
11. Share your gifts with others.

Business Meeting Minutes November 14

The meeting was called to order at 1:45 p.m. by President Barb Overholt. Also in attendance were, Vice-President Marlene Bird, Treasurer Sharon La Bouff, Programs Chair Mary Kahn, and Secretary Susanne Koga.

2020 Calendar of Events – Barb provided the latest calendar of events and National Night Out at the Triton and art pickup at Triton were added.

Art Show – Organization of the 22nd annual art show has been finalized. Sharon will explain the sign-up procedure to the membership in early 2020. Choosing a date to host will be on a first-come-first-served basis and artists must sign up at a General Meeting. Artists must also attend a General Meeting in May or June to sign up for art reception food. The art show lasts five weekends and Barb will be sure that's always the understanding with the Triton Museum. She intends to meet with Esther Fernandez and possibly Preston Metcalf in early 2020 to discuss the show's particulars in person.

Member Questions – Barb has received emails from members asking questions where the answers can be easily found by simply reading the newsletter. Membership is encouraged to read their monthly newsletter, her online email blasts, and the Guild's website for answers to their questions.

Demonstration Artist Recruitment – Barb suggested reiterating the importance of member participation in finding artists for monthly demonstrations. Sharon suggested a Sherlock Holmes cartoon bringing attention to the paragraph stating member responsibilities at the top of the Calendar of Events.

Membership Renewals – Sharon will start collecting membership renewals at the December 7 General Meeting and Holiday Potluck. Checks are preferred but if members pay with cash, exact amount is required; Sharon will not be able to make change.


Damaged Threshold – Barb notified the church administrator of the First Congregational Church, that the threshold strip between the kitchen and the Guild's meeting room had deteriorated.

Campbell Storefront Window Program – The Guild, as an organization, will not be participating in this program but if individual members are interested, they are invited to participate at their own risk. The board read the City's proposed documents and application, and found them unacceptable where artists rights are concerned. Rewrites were suggested by the Guild's board that would protect professional artists.

Award Ribbons – The Guild needs to order award ribbons for the 2020 art show. We currently have the following number of ribbons: six First, nine Second, 11 Third, 0 Best of Show, 1 Special Award, and 21 "participant" ribbons. The board decided to dispense with the participant ribbons as they relate to the art show but the remaining ones could be used for members who go above and beyond for the Guild. Barb will order ribbons in bulk making it more cost-effective.

No business meeting is scheduled for December. The meeting was adjourned at 2:45 PM.

Pastel Demonstration with Los Gatos-based Artist Sam Pearson



We welcomed Sam Pearson to our October 26 General Meeting where he provided a fabulous demonstration into the world of pastels! We were in awe of his talent and expertise in creating a beautiful piece of art in such a short period of time. His demo included sharing what he has learned over the years and also sharing his completed art pieces. His demo started by presenting quick value and composition studies in deciding lights/darks, detail, center of interest, warm and cool colors. He first created a watercolor underpainting on University Art's 280 sanded paper using complimentary colors that he anticipated using prior to applying Ludwig hard and soft pastels.


