October 23 Workshop

Art Supply List for "Accessing Your Abstract Artist Soul"

- At least six 8x10 or 9x12 Sheets of Paper (mixed media).
- Ballpoint or felt tip pens (black or a dark color).
- 1" painting sponge with handle and/or #12 round brush and/or 1" or 2" soft flat brush.
- Paint or Pastel Watercolor paint and/or fluid acrylic paint and/or heavy body acrylic paint and/or pastel stick (at least 1" in length).
- Select at least 3 warm colors (reds, oranges, yellows), 2 cool colors (greens, blues, violets), one very dark color (black, indigo).
- Painter's tape and a stiff backing larger than the paper size to tape paper upon to prevent buckling.
- If using paint, #12 round brush or 1" or 2" soft flat brush.
- Plastic gloves or "Invisible Care" cream as a skin barrier.
- Face mask against dust if using pastels.
- Water or medium for thinning or washes.



Business Meeting Minutes October 14



This meeting was held online via Zoom and was called to order at 2:05 pm. In attendance were: President Diann Klink, Vice President Marlene Bird, Treasurer Sharon LaBouff, Programs Chair Mary Kahn, Secretary Kris Rogers, and Annual Art Show Chair/Newsletter Editor Barb Overholt.

Membership • Newsletter – Barb requested Sharon prepare a membership renewal announcement for the upcoming newsletters giving the rational for our dues increase to \$50. The Board reviewed the yearly expenditures of Unfunded Zoom Cost, Major Web Development, and Room Rental. These all equate to a general increase in expenses. The attending membership on September 25 gave unanimous approval for the increase in dues to \$50.00 which includes the money collected during monthly inperson meetings for the room rental. Reminder is to be sent out by Barb in the upcoming newsletters.

Annual Art Show – Diann, Awards Co-Chair Elton Glover, and Barb met via Zoom on October 13 to finalize the itinerary for the Annual Art Show. The slideshow will go live on October 15 on YouTube. com. There are 14 participants with three pieces of art each.

Since the October edition of "Brush and Palette" is finished, the results of the Annual Award winners will be placed in the November issue.

Yearly Board Election will take place at the December 4 Holiday Meeting. The Artist Trading Cards exchange will take place again and be facilitated by Barb.

Bylaws – There have been a number of changes in the Guild's Bylaws which are not reflected in our current stock of published booklets. The most significant changes – the art categories for our annual show, and the new dues amount. The booklets do not appear to be used by members and the Board agreed that the Bylaws should be kept online for downloading going forward.

Website – Upon looking over the Guild's website recently, Barb found discrepancies in the information it contained and she will contact Yelena to make the necessary changes/corrections.

Treasurer's Report – \$346 was spent on Annual Art Show ribbons; an additional \$133 was spent on the monthly competition ribbons. Treasury Balance: \$1068 - our lowest to date.

Barb purchased a package of 25 clasp envelopes for mailing the award ribbons to their recipients(\$11.71). Marlene felt that the ribbons should be fastened to lightweight cardboard so they arrive in pristine condition. Diann and Barb will explore mailing options.

Art Sales from Art Show – The date for Treasurer Sharon La Bouff to receive 10% from any sales generated from the Annual Art Show was set to 30 days or November 16.

Future Demonstrators – Diann Klink will be the demonstrator for October. It is to be a workshop titled, "Accessing Your Abstract Artist Soul". This will be part one of a six-part series for member participation.

Program Chair Position – Mary would like to step down as Programs Chair due to life challenges. We have several individuals that would be candidates as demonstrators if needed (Preston Metcalf, Jeff Braumschreiber, Jaya King, Diann Klink, and Elton Glover). Diann suggested that we could have artists demonstrate remotely and have them viewed on a screen when we return to our in-person meetings. Kris suggested that we could use free YouTube instruction in a pinch. Sharon mentioned that the projector at the church is too expensive to rent. Our online tech guru Elton Glover will be consulted regarding any remote viewing. At the October meeting, volunteers for the Program Co-Chair position will be requested. If there are no volunteers, requests will be made again in the December meeting.

The business meeting was adjourned at 3:05 pm. Kris Rogers, Secretary

Membership Dues to Rise in 2022

Fellow Artists -

At our September 25 Membership Meeting via Zoom, an increase in annual dues was proposed and unanimously approved by the attending membership.

The need for an increase is due to:

- In anticipation of returning to in-person meetings, the Board looked at ways to maintain social distancing and reduce close interaction. Removing the Cash Box for room rental seemed a logical move as the monthly cost would be covered by our yearly dues.
- 2. Our resources have been depleted by the additional cost of having a Zoom account over the past year.
- 3. We had a major website redesign expense.

4. The previous web hosting company the Guild had used for many years became unresponsive to our webmaster's inquiries. Thus, our new web host comes at a higher price.

We have all seen costs go up in general but we have been fortunate that our demonstrators have not asked for an increase for their talent in providing us with inspiration and education in spite of their Zoom expenses. However, we should be aware this could change.

Membership voted unanimously to increase Active member dues to \$50 and Associate member dues to \$25 for the calendar year 2022.


